1 About Us

Tango Energy is a retail arm of Pacific Hydro Pty Ltd (ABN 31 057 279 508) a leading generator of wind, solar and hydro power with a history spanning over 30 years, and a brand of Pacific Blue Retail Pty Ltd (ABN 43 155 908 839). Tango Energy provides energy plans to customers across Victoria, New South Wales, South Australia and Queensland.

2 About the Consumer Data Right

The Consumer Data Right (**CDR**) allows you to give accredited businesses access to your consumer data so they can offer products and services tailored to your needs.

Only accredited businesses can operate under the CDR. These businesses are known as Accredited Data Recipients (**ADRs**) which provide products and services, and Data Holders which are businesses that hold consumer data and must transfer the data to an ADR at the consumer's request.

The CDR is an opt-in system. You have the choice to authorise a business to access your consumer data as well as what data is transferred, and you can withdraw your consent to have your data shared at any time.

3 Tango Energy and the CDR

Tango Energy, as a brand of Pacific Blue Retail (ABN 43 155 908 839), has been designated as a Data Holder under the CDR (provider number DH777819).

4 About this Policy

This policy details your consumer rights under the CDR scheme, and contains information on how you can:

- request Tango Energy (as a Data Holder) to share your consumer data with ADRs;
- access and correct your consumer data that we hold about you; and
- make a complaint about how Tango Energy (as a Data Holder) handles your consumer data.

5 Eligible customers

This Policy only applies to Tango Energy customers who are eligible to share their CDR data. You are eligible if:

- you are over 18 years old;
- you are either a primary or joint secondary account holder of an electricity account with Tango Energy;
- you have an open residential or business electricity account with us, or your account has been open in the last 24 months;
- the electricity usage on your account (including all service locations under that account) is under 5GWh in the last 12 months, or your estimated usage is under 5GWh if your account is less than 12 months old; and
- you are not an off-market embedded network customer.

6 Nominated Representative/Secondary User

Please call or write to us to add or remove a nominated representative/secondary user (see the 'Contact us' section below). A nominated representative/secondary user will have the rights to:

- view data sharing arrangements that you have authorised through Tango Energy;
- view the type of data we have shared; and
- change or withdraw data sharing authorisations that you have provided to Tango Energy.

All nominated representatives/secondary users must be at least 18 years of age.

For business accounts

A business must assign at least one individual as a nominated representative to manage data sharing from their business' electricity account. Tango Energy is not required, nor authorised to disclose data for a business that has not appointed a nominated representative.

Even though business customers will have one or more authorised contacts on their Tango Energy account, data cannot be shared under the CDR until a nominated representative has been appointed for CDR data sharing purposes.

If you are appointed as a nominated representative for your business, you can log onto Tango Energy's online CDR dashboard to manage data sharing from your business' electricity account.

For residential accounts

A residential account holder may request that an additional individual, known as a Secondary User, be allocated to their account for data sharing purposes.

Please contact us to set up a Secondary User for CDR data purposes, who as an authorised representative under your electricity account will have the rights to access your electricity usage, export and billing information. Once an authorised representative has been added to your account, you will need to enable 'secondary user instructions' on the CDR dashboard (accessible at <https://consent cdr.tangoenergy.com/>).

Where a person has been assigned with authority to act by a State Trustee, Court Appointed Authority or a person with Power of Attorney to manage your electricity account on your behalf (as the account holder), the person with the Authority to Act will be able to authorise data sharing and CDR preferences on your behalf in line with the scope of their authority. You will need to contact us to add or remove an authority to act.

7 What CDR data does Tango Energy share?

Tango Energy as a Data Holder is obliged to make your consumer data available for sharing if you request us to do so. The specific consumer data we can share is listed below (**CDR data**):

- your name, supply address and contact details;
- details about your energy plan and energy account including your account number, fuel type, product data, payment arrangements and concession information; and
- your billing and invoicing data;
- Australian Energy Market Operator (**AEMO**) data, including National Meter Identifier (**NMI**) data, distributed energy resources (**DER**) data, and your metering data (usage data).

8 When will Tango Energy share your CDR data?

Tango Energy will only share your CDR data if you provide authorisation for us to do so. You can authorise us to share your CDR data with an ADR so they can provide you with a product or service. The steps to allow this are detailed below:

- an ADR will ask you to confirm that you want to share your CDR data held by Tango Energy;
- Tango Energy will then verify your identity by sending a one-time password to the email address associated with your energy account. Be sure to never share your one-time account with anyone;
- you will be given the option to select which of your energy accounts to share with the ADR (if you have more than one) and what types of CDR data you want to share;
- you will be notified what types of CDR data Tango Energy will be sharing and the time period it will be shared for; and
- we will ask for your consent and authorisation for us to share the specified CDR data with the ADR.

9 Situations when Tango Energy may refuse to share your CDR data

Tango Energy may refuse to share your CDR data with an ADR in the below circumstances:

- we believe refusal is necessary to prevent physical or financial harm or abuse;
- we reasonably believe that disclosing some or all of your CDR data would negatively impact the security, integrity or stability of any CDR systems;
- your CDR data is connected to an account that is suspended or blocked; or
- we are required to refuse provision of the CDR data in accordance with any relevant CDR laws or data standards.

10 Access to and correction of CDR data

You can review, access, and update your CDR data yourself online via our CDR dashboard, or alternatively you can raise a request with our contact centre.

10.1 Tango Energy CDR dashboard

At any time, you can review all CDR data you have authorised us to share via the Tango Energy CDR dashboard. Simply visit <https://consent cdr.tangoenergy.com/>.

10.2 Tango Energy contact centre

- Call us or write to us to update your CDR data (see the 'Contact us' section below), or to request a record of the CDR data we hold for you.
- As soon as possible we will acknowledge receipt of your request.
- If you requested a change to your CDR data, we will let you know in writing of the following:
 - a) if we corrected your CDR data; or
 - b) (if applicable) if we included a qualifying statement with your CDR data; or
 - c) if we consider the correction unnecessary or we are unable to fulfill your request. Reasons will be provided if we cannot update your CDR data.
 - d) If some or all of the CDR data concerned is metering data (usage data) or NMI (national meter identifier) standing data, we will advise AEMO of your request in accordance with the relevant correction procedures under the National Electricity Rules and will advise you of this in writing.
 - e) If the data is DER register data, we will provide you with information about how you can contact the distributor directly to have the data updated (we cannot do this).

- We will not charge you a fee for changing, viewing or requesting a record of your CDR data.
- We will also let you know of the complaint options available to you if you disagree with our actions.

10.3 Accessing and correcting CDR data that is also personal information

Some CDR data is also personal information, and you also have a right to access and correct any personal information that Tango Energy stores on your behalf. You should refer to our [Privacy Policy](#) for details of how to do this.

11 How to withdraw consent for CDR data sharing

If you no longer want your CDR data to be shared with an ADR, you can withdraw your CDR consent at any time via the Tango Energy CDR dashboard <https://consent.cdr.tangoenergy.com/>.

Alternatively, please call or write to our contact centre and we'll be able to assist you on how to revoke your consent (see the 'Contact us' section below).

12 Complaints handling

12.1 Customer complaints

We want to hear from you if you have a concern with how we handle your CDR data.

Our Standard Complaints Handling and Dispute Resolution Procedure conforms to Standards Australia 10002-2022 Guidelines for complaints management in organizations. We are committed to ensuring that complaints are resolved in accordance with this Standard.

Our complaints handling procedure ensures that if you ever wish to register a complaint:

- You will know exactly where and how you can contact us
- We will provide you with any assistance you may require registering your complaint
- We will not charge any complaints handling fees for investigating and resolving your complaint
- Your complaint will be addressed quickly, fairly and in an objective and unbiased way
- Your complaint will remain private and confidential
- You will always have the option to raise the complaint with your local energy ombudsman (details provided below)

12.2 External dispute handling

If you are unhappy with our response or with the manner that we handled your complaint, you may contact your local Ombudsman.

Your local Ombudsman provides a free, impartial and independent complaints resolution service and will usually expect that you have tried to resolve your complaint with us prior to raising the matter with them.

Your local Ombudsman operates Monday to Friday during normal business hours.
